## ADMINISTRATIVE POLICY 7.16

#### **ALTERNATIVE SCHOOL PROGRAMS**

#### (1) GENERAL PRINCIPLES

- (a) Milwaukee Public Schools students represent a wide range of cultural, ethnic, and social backgrounds, and their needs differ from school to school as well as within a single school.
- (b) In response to these needs, the Board may periodically approve the establishment of a variety of alternatives to the regular school program. Such alternatives may include, but shall not necessarily be limited to, program improvements developed by the staffs of individual schools.
- (c) All proposals for alternative schools and programs shall be presented by the superintendent to the Board for its consideration and action.

### (2) REPORTS ON ALTERNATIVE PROGRAMS

The Administration shall provide the Board with a routine monthly report on alternative education enrollments, to include:

- (a) the capacity and current enrollment of each of the Milwaukee Public Schools and partnership programs;
- (b) current vacancies for at-risk students in each program;
- (c) monthly attendance percentage for each program.
