Many data sources are studied regularly at Honey Creek. Direct Instruction reading program has built in check for mastery at every 5 or 10 lessons depending on the level of the program. The teachers, interventionist, and principal review the data to determine the next steps for students.

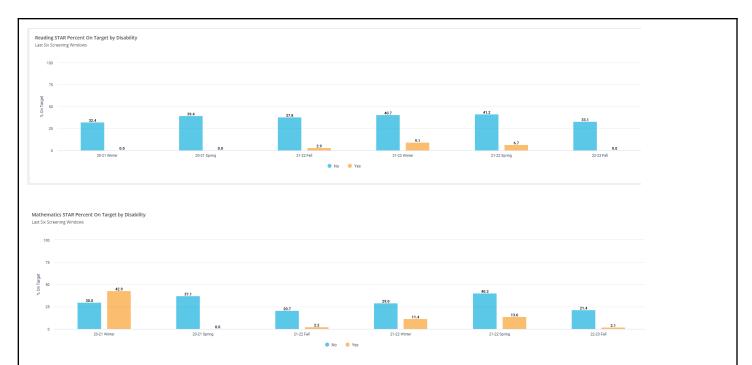


Honey Creek Continuous Progress School community has been working on closing the achievement gap primarily for our economically disadvantaged students. We continue to have improvements and growth to make.

Also, a priority area continues to be the gap for students with disabilities. Honey Creek has added a bridging unit since our last contract. We have 25.6% of our population identified with special education needs. We are trying to push into the regular education classrooms more with support so that students are being exposed to the grade level curriculum. Building background knowledge and vocabulary are focused in our SIP for all students, but these strategies are especially helpful for native learners.

Family involvement at Honey Creek has been an integral part of our Charter School success. We are always recruiting for stable members of our governance board and our parent activity committee. Our board is always 51% parents. According to the smiles we see every morning and the data concerning Honey Creek around providing a welcoming environment, taken the MPS Parent and Family Surveys, satisfaction ratings have been growing from the mid 70% to a high 98% last year feeling that they are welcome at this school. The continuous increase in "open enrolled" families from our neighboring districts to our school shows that Honey Creek Continuous Progress Charter School is a destination for learning in our city as well as our surrounding communities. Families feel very welcome in our school and continue to work as a team with our staff as we engage their children in their individualized learning journeys.

We also have begun a parent group for students with special needs. This group began last year and continues to meet this year.
