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Administration Response:

MPS contracts with Teach for America to provide teacher candidates based on district need for employment. Based on the service agreement, teachers must be in critical teacher shortage areas of special education, bilingual, math, science, Spanish, and a limited number of elementary teachers based on need. Teach for America interns are committed to two years at MPS and are associated with the national Americorps program. At the end of the two-year commitment, the interns may transition to status of a licensed teacher.

Teach for America recruits and provides pre-service training for teaching candidates and professional development services.

As of March 3, 2019, there were 58 Teach for America interns employed at MPS. Teach for America is expected to use reasonable efforts to recruit teachers from diverse backgrounds. Current interns include 42 females and 16 males of which 10 are African-American, 34 White, 9 Hispanic and 5 Asian.

Total cost for the Teach for America contract in FY17 was \$48,960; FY18 \$48,999.50; FY19 \$49,000. The cost charged per teacher was approximately \$1,000. We only pay for the number of teachers we hire, it is up to the maximum contract amount. The current contract will expire in June 2019.

The interns fill vacancies in critical areas and are assigned to schools based on district need.
