For the 2020-21 school year, the district received a federal waiver for test participation in meeting the 95% requirement. The test participation for the school and district is indicated in "total tested"

for comparison. Comparisons must be made with extreme caution, since test participation may vary widely between schools and the district.

SCHOOL'S ADDITIONAL COMMENTS OR DATA TO SUPPORT ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE STANDARDS

Highland Community School has consistently followed the educational program outlined in our charter contract, which requires meeting or exceeding the MPS district proficiency scores. While the school faced challenges due to learning losses from the 2020 pandemic, it remains committed to improvement and has seen overall proficiency levels that meet or exceed the district average. While there has been progress in English Language Arts (ELA), math proficiency rates have stagnated. Highland has begun to apply successful strategies from our reading and writing initiatives to enhance math outcomes, aiming for growth in this area during the upcoming contract term, with a particular focus on improving achievement rates for Black students.

SCHOOL'S COMMENTS TO FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE STANDARDS

During the contract term, Highland Community School achieved successful annual audits with no major findings and the effective management of finances that supported a stable operational

environment. We utilized ESSER funds to enhance technology and curriculum, ensuring continuity during the Covid pandemic, and also raised over \$150,000 through a capital campaign to fund a facility expansion, which added secure entrances and additional classrooms. These efforts have positioned Highland for future improvements, including better air quality and air conditioning.
