SUMMARY COMMENTS				

Next Door's mission of supporting the whole child is evident throughout the supporting documents and the site visit. Next Door supports the intellectual, physical, and emotional development of children by partnering with families for success in school and the community. Next Door Charter

School is connected to a larger organization, Next Door Foundation, and is able to offer

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wrap-around services and opportunities for both students and families. Next Door Charter School serves students in grade K4 and the organization serves families and children starting from birth.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Based on the evidence provided in the Charter School Application for Renewal, Preliminary Performance Summary, site visit (which included a school presentation, classroom visits, and testimony from staff and parents), and additional information from the school team, the Charter School Review Team recommends a full-term charter school contract renewal.

Next Door offers a comprehensive educational program to children with a focus on tailored academics and teaching strategies that includes social emotional development. The family advocates and student support services are foundational components to support the student's school readiness. Next Door is child-centered and family-focused. The school has been intentional on the implementation of the Pyramid Model which includes Guided Play.

The Team noted that the staff, parents, governing board, and school leadership are part of a well-organized, student-centered, early childhood organization. Next Door has developed a skill level in both reading and social development that has a positive impact on the surrounding community.

The support and resources that Next Door provides families is unmatched and a vital asset to the community. This is evidenced by the parents who provided testimony to the organization. Next Door believes that the quality of the teacher is key to the quality of the programming within the classroom. Next Door invests in staff development, which supports teacher retention and impact on children.

#### **ACADEMIC STANDARDS**

Next Door has met 50% of its academic performance standards. Since the school is serving students in K4, the current contract measures are not aligned to K4 assessments. To align best practices with early childhood education, Next Door uses assessment data to determine progression of student growth in both reading and math. The school is a comprehensive educational program with a focus on tailored academics and teaching strategies, as well as to support social emotional development. Next Door's approach is to strengthen the student's reciprocal relationships with other students, families, teachers, society, and the school environment.

Next Door implements research based, developmentally appropriate curriculum using best teaching practices. The curriculum is continuously adapted and aligned to state and national early childhood standards. The school utilizes Brigance and Bridges assessments in the areas of literacy and mathematics. Recent assessment scores in both areas show a significant growth from fall to spring.

#### FINANCIAL STANDARDS

Next Door has consistently met its financial performance standards. The organization continues to be a budget conscious organization and maintains a financial management system that provides accurate and complete disclosure of the financial activities.

# ORGANIZATIONAL STANDARDS

Next Door has consistently met its organizational performance standards. Next Door has connected with a range of community partners to support the students' educational opportunities and healthy living outcomes. Families continue to be the center of the work to support the whole child. Parents are part of the policy council to keep them informed on topics and to be empowered in shared decision-making.

#### SCHOOL SITE VISIT

Next Door's presentation provided further information around organizational supports for the development of the whole child. The school team recognizes the value of teachers and invests in the staff through building educators, emphasizing collaboration and support with coaching and reflective supervisions. Guided play has become the center of their work that builds social-emotional and collaborative learning environment for children. Next Door bridges academics for students through guided play by having children work together to problem-solve and discover learning through collaboration. Next Door uses a trauma informed lens that provides social-emotional learning and self-regulating strategies that are guided by the Pyramid Model.

During the site visit, the Team recognized the strong safety measures that are in place throughout the Next Door organization that parents appreciate as they feel confident in trusting Next Door with their children.

## CLASSROOM OBSERVATIONS

There was strong evidence of literacy components, guided play, and the development of the whole child. Students were engaged in multiple activities to support the academic, and social-emotional development. Students displayed joy as they were learning through play and building relationships with their peers. The support that is available in all classrooms was evident of their intentionality to support the children. Through teachers, educational assistants, Leading Men Fellows, and additional support staff, Next Door has created an environment where all staff feel valued and know the importance of their work in the classroom. The classrooms are rich in print material to support student learnering.

## **READ WITH ME**

The Read with Me program provides opportunities for volunteers to read with students weekly. The Team had the opportunity to read books with the K4 students. The Team experienced how students look forward to this special time. This is a valuable practice for students to have a positive place for exposure to literacy and to build their home library.

## PARENT FOCUS GROUP

Parents expressed how the organization provides resources to families through individualized support. Next Door has a number of community resources that support the children's well-being. This includes but is not limited to: Children's Hospital, Medical College of Wisconsin, DentaMed Dental Clinic, Aurora Health Care, Fatherhood initiative, and Literacy Lab. There are many opportunities to be involved through volunteering, committees, and policy council. As one parent stated, "Next Door is home here. There is so much love."

Next Door provides a birth to kindergarten model which is vital to the Milwaukee community. Next Door prepares students to be school ready and builds positive and meaningful relationships with families.
