MILWAUKEE BOARD OF SCHOOL DIRECTORS PROFESSIONAL SERVICES CONTRACT EXTENSION & MODIFICATION

On November 1, 2015, the Milwaukee Board of School Directors and Milwaukee Education Partnership, Inc. entered into Professional Services Contract number C024327 with a term of November 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016. The Contract, (¶ 2), provided for two additional one-year extensions upon mutual written consent of the parties and in consideration of the performance metrics listed therein. Based on the Contractor's achievement of those performance metrics, the parties now mutually agree to extend the Contract for the first additional one-year term.

As such, the Contract will be extended for a second term, from January 1, 2017 through June 30, 2017, under the same terms and conditions as set forth in the original Contract, except for those specifically set forth below.

The amount to be encumbered on the Contract shall not exceed \$50,000.00 in Year 2.

In accordance with ¶ 19 of the Contract, the parties also modify those terms and conditions identified below.

MODIFIED TERMS:

1. Paragraph 1 of the Contract is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

“Contractor will support MPS's efforts to enhance the quality of teaching and learning in Milwaukee Public Schools. The broad initiative of Contractor is to ensure that every child is performing at or above grade level in reading, writing, mathematics and science through shared responsibility for student success. Programmatic initiatives include:

- a) Teacher and administrator professional development in particular regarding the climate/culture of MPS;
- b) Inviting Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) to MPS with the goal of assisting MPS in recruiting teachers of color;
- c) Student college and career readiness, and student character and academic skills enhancement;
- d) Acting as a pipeline to HBCUs for our students by identifying promising students interested in attending these institutions and linking them to scholarship and internship opportunities;
- e) Within the Milwaukee community Contractor shall, in partnership with Enterprise Rent-A-Car, conduct a book bag drive for MPS students;
- f) Work with MKE Fellows Initiative to identify and support young men that are engaged in summer internships with Milwaukee Institutions; and
- g) Work in conjunction with GEAR-UP, Milwaukee Grade-Level Reading Campaign, Historically Black Colleges and Universities Initiative, and the Early Childhood Development Collaboration.

Contractor will also support the mission of Project METRO, a local collaboration that will identify and support regional talent dedicated to serving in the Milwaukee Public Schools with high demand certifications (e.g., mathematics, science, bilingual and special education).”

2. Paragraph 3 is modified to add the following provision: “Total compensation under this Contract, for Year 2 shall not exceed \$50,000.00.”

3. Paragraph 5 of the Contract is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

“In the performance of work under this Contract, Contractor shall not discriminate in any way against any employee or applicant for employment on the basis of a person’s sex, race, age, religion, national origin, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation, disability, or socio-economic status. This prohibition includes but is not limited to employment; promotions, demotions and transfers; recruitment; advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeships. Contractor is required to include a similar provision in all subcontracts to this Contract.

If MPS determines Contractor has violated this non-discrimination policy, MPS may terminate this Contract without liability for undelivered services or materials. MPS may also deem the Contractor ineligible to participate in future contracts with MPS.”

4. Paragraph 7 of the Contract is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

“Contractor will conduct, at Contractor’s expense, a criminal information records background check, (hereinafter referred to as “background check”), through the Wisconsin Department of Justice and other appropriate states’ agencies, on all current and potential administrators, board members, officers, and employees who have, or who are anticipated to have, “direct, unsupervised contact” with MPS students in the performance of this Contract.

An out of state background check should be completed in the state(s) in which the individual resided for at least six months within the last two years and was eighteen years or older at the time.

Contractor will submit to MPS’s Department of Employment Relations (DER), (via mail to Milwaukee Public Schools Background Checks, Attn: Department of Employment Relations, Room 116, 5225 West Vliet Street, Milwaukee, WI 53208, or via email at 564@milwaukee.k12.wi.us), all completed background checks. Such records will be reviewed and MPS will notify Contractor of any individual(s) who, based on MPS standards, are unfit and should not have contact with MPS students. All determinations made by MPS with regards to whether an individual is fit to provide services pursuant to this Contract are made in MPS’s sole discretion.


The following will each be a material failure to comply with the terms of this Contract and cause for immediate termination of this Contract by MPS: failure to perform background checks as outlined in this Section 7; failure to submit background checks to MPS as outlined in this Section 7; allowing services to be provided by an individual who has not be subjected to a background check; and allowing services to be performed by an individual who has been determined to be unfit by MPS as outlined in this Section 7.”

5. Paragraph 16(C) of the Contract is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

“Contractor shall comply with, and ensure its subcontractors performing work under this Contract comply with, Milwaukee Board of School Directors’ Administrative Policy 3.09(17), which requires that employees be paid a ‘living wage’.”
